**Amendments to Dial World Communications, LLC Application and Petition for Certificate of Convenience and Necessity to Provide Intrastate Telecommunications Services
Docket T-20921A-14-0390**

(A-11) Dial World Communications, LLC ("Applicant" or "Dial World") has been and is currently involved in proceedings before state public utility commissions. Further information is provided below:

North Carolina – Applicant received notification from the North Carolina Utilities Commission of cancellation of its certificate to provide long distance services in state on October 2011. Subsequent to receiving notice of its regulatory noncompliance, Applicant filed the Regulatory Fee Report, but did not include an application for reinstatement, which resulted in the cancellation notice. In communications with North Carolina Staff, we understand the state does not regulate prepaid calling cards, but we have commenced all steps necessary to ensure resolution of the issue.

Texas – Dial World's license with the Public Utility Commission of Texas was revoked in May 2011. Dial World's authority to transact business in the state was also forfeited because Dial World was not in good standing with the Texas Public Comptroller. To remedy these deficiencies, Dial World retroactively filed Franchise Tax Reports with the Texas Public Comptroller. Once the tax deficiencies were remedied, the Secretary of State authority was reinstated. At that point, Dial World filed a new application for authority to provide interexchange authority in Texas, which was granted in May 2015.

(A-12) Applicant has had a judgment and investigation by the California Public Utilities Commission:

California – Dial World was identified as a carrier providing prepaid calling card services in California without authority. On September 23, 2013, Dial World applied for long distance service authority. On November 12, 2013, the California Public Utilities Commission's Safety & Enforcement Division (SED) protested the application based on the unauthorized operations and failure to pay applicable surcharges and fee. Dial World and the SED were able to reach a settlement agreement under which Dial World was assessed a penalty. The presiding Administrative Law Judge approved the settlement agreement and granted Dial World a Certificate of Public Convenience & Necessity effective June 11, 2015. Dial World has since paid on all unremitted surcharges and fees, and has and continues to comply with the terms of the settlement agreement and Commission order granting authority to Dial World. The attached document titled "Supporting Documentation to A.12" includes the Final Order under Proceeding A.13-09-018.

(A-18) Applicant has not had an application denied. Applicant has received approval to offer telecommunications services similar to those that the Applicant will or intends to offer in Arizona, in the following states:

California, Florida, Hawaii, Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, New York, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Texas, and Wisconsin
