

PUBLIC NOTICE OF THE HEARING
ON THE APPLICATION OF
ARROYO WATER COMPANY LLC FOR
AN EMERGENCY RATE INCREASE.
DOCKET NO. W-04286A-15-0339

On September 28, 2015, Arroyo Water Company INC ("Company") filed an application with the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") for approval of an emergency rate increase. The Company is requesting an emergency increase in rates to cover repairs to its water system. The Company requests emergency rate relief in the amount of \$72,000.

The Commission's Utilities Division ("Staff") is in the process of evaluating the Company's request, and will file its recommendation in this matter by November 16, 2015. The Commission is not bound by the proposals made by the Company, Staff or possible intervenors, and the Commission may approve the amount of the request, modify the amount (higher or lower), or deny the request.

The Commission will conduct a hearing on this matter on December 7, 2015, commencing at 10:00 a.m., at the Commission's Phoenix offices, Hearing Room No. 1, 1200 West Washington, Phoenix 85007. Written public comments may be submitted by mailing a letter referencing **Docket No. W-04286A-15-0339** to Arizona Corporation Commission, Consumer Services Section, 1200 West Washington, Phoenix, AZ 85007, or by submitting comments on the Commission's website (www.azcc.gov) using the "Submit a Public Comment for a Utility" function. Copies of the parties' filings are available for public inspection during regular business hours at Arroyo's offices located at 211 West Saddle Lane, Payson, Arizona 85541 and at the Commission's Docket Control Center at 1200 West Washington Street, Phoenix, Arizona 85007. All documents filed in this matter are also available on the Commission's website (www.azcc.gov) using the e-Docket function and entering Docket No. W-04286A-15-0339.

The law provides for an open public hearing at which, under appropriate circumstances, interested parties may intervene. Any person or entity entitled by law to intervene and having a direct and substantial interest in the matter will be permitted to intervene. Anyone who wishes to intervene must file an original and 13 copies of a written motion to intervene with the Commission's Docket Control Center no later than **November 23, 2015**, and send a copy of the motion to the Company or its counsel and to all parties of record. Your motion to intervene must contain the following:

1. Your name, address, and telephone number and the name, address, and telephone number of any person upon whom service of documents is to be made, if not yourself;
2. The docket number for the case: W-04286A-15-0339;
3. A short statement explaining:
 - a. Your interest in the proceeding (e.g. a customer or potential customer of the Company, a member or shareholder of the Company, etc.);
 - b. How you will be directly and substantially affected by the outcome of the case; and
 - c. Why your intervention will not unduly broaden the issues in the case;
4. A statement certifying that you have served a copy of the motion to intervene on the Company or its counsel and on all other parties of record in the case; and
5. If you are not represented by an attorney who is an active member of the Arizona State Bar, and you are not representing yourself as an individual, sufficient information and any appropriate documentation to demonstrate compliance with Arizona Supreme Court Rules 31, 38 and 42, as applicable.

The granting of motions to intervene shall be governed by A.A.C. R 14-3-105, except that all motions to intervene must be filed on or before November 23 2015. If representation by counsel is required by Arizona Supreme Court Rule 3 1, intervention will be conditioned upon the intervenor obtaining counsel to represent the intervenor. Information about intervention is available on the Commission's at www.azcc.gov, through the "Intervention in Utility Cases" function. The granting of intervention, among other things, entitles a party to present sworn evidence at the hearing and to cross-examine other witnesses. However, failure to intervene will not preclude any interested person or entity from appearing at the hearing and providing public comment or from filing written comments in the record of the case.

The Commission does not discriminate on the basis of disability in admission to its public meetings.
