Instead, energy companies go to politicians to set rates that are both anti-competitive and guarantee healthy profits for old technologies that would not happen in a free market, because free people would choose a cleaner and cheaper alternative.

For example, Morningstar currently rates Pinnacle West Capital Corporation stock as a buy because you've already guaranteed them at least 5 years of healthy profits for APS. And still they all want more. They all come back to the regulatory trough over and over again.

It's exactly like forcing all citizens to buy Converse tennis shoes, regardless of whether they want them or not, or would prefer an alternative. Nope, everybody has to buy Converse tennis shoes at a premium price of \$150 a pair. In fact, a government agency is going to make you buy them at that inflated price, because Converse stockholders want even more money than they're already making.

Obviously that would be nuts. And yet, time and again, private companies that provide dirty energy want to force us all to keep buying a product we don't want at a price set by you. That is not free market capitalism. They want all the rewards and none of the risks. Wouldn't we all?

Then there are the Stupid Accounting Tricks. Less profit does not belong in the "loss" category. It's still a profit.

The conservative Republican town of Georgetown, Texas, just went with 100% renewable energy. It was a simple accounting decision. In the meantime, Oklahoma was just hit with a 5.2 Richter scale earthquake due to fracking waste. When is enough damage to people and the USA, and consumer abuse, enough?

Act like the public servants you are supposed to be. Tell these companies they must rely on the free market, like they said they wanted when utilities were privatized, and tell them to offer products consumers want at a price consumers are willing to pay, without regulation or coercion.
