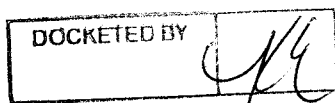

Dear Chairman Little,

I strongly urge you to reject UNS Energy's recent proposal to impose demand charges and eliminate net metering.

This is just a back door method to remove incentives for the people of the Arizona community to install residential solar and help solve our energy problems. The solution to global warming and the increased cost of electrical power generation and distribution is to install delocalized residential solar so the power is generated when and where it is needed.

Under the current model the consumer pays the up front installation cost which is recovered over a 8-10 year period. The solar customer does not start to get a ROI until after 8-10 years. If these new demand charges are added and net metering is stopped, then it is not possible for the residential user to ever break even. Residential solar installation will stop and that is what has been observed in the SRP district where restrictive plans have already been put in place. This plan is nothing more or less than a blatant attempt to kill residential solar. STOP THIS EFFORT.

Furthermore the proposed plans will generate perverse incentives. For example instead of minimizing my use during the day and running my AC at night, this plan will encourage me to run the AC during the day when solar generation is highest and turn the AC off at night to avoid peak demand charges. This is a silly way to run things. The plan should encourage me to charge the grid during the day when the load is high and draw from the grid at night for a balanced load. Why would power companies want this incentive?? Its simple - the goal is to drive residential solar out of business and maintain their monopoly.

Reject UNS Energy's proposal. It is a power grab that erodes consumer choice and control over bills in order to ensure captive ratepayers for their monopoly.

If this plan is put through I will install batteries and go off grid along with my neighbors but who wants this war. You can stop this silliness now with an intelligent vote.
