On October 28, 2015, Liberty Utilities (Bella Vista Water Corp. ("Liberty")) filed with the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission"). In docket No. W-02465A-15-0367 an application requesting that the Commission establish the fair value of its plant and property used for the provision of public water utility service for Bella Vista Water and, based on such finding, approve permanent rates and charges for utility service designed to produce a fair return thereon. On November 2, 2015, Liberty filed with the Commission, in Docket No. W-02465A-15-0370, an application requesting authority from the Commission to issue evidence of indebtedness for Bella Vista Water in a total amount not to exceed \$4,700,000.

Liberty requests authorization to increase its rates to generate total revenues by \$6,179,027. This would constitute an increase in revenues by \$1,554,297, or 33.61 percent over last year revenues of \$4,624,730. For information about how Liberty's revenue increase would affect your individual bill, you may contact Liberty at 520-458-5470.

The Commission's Utilities Division ("Staff") is in the process of auditing and analyzing the applications, and has not yet made any recommendations regarding Liberty's proposed rate increase or financing application. 





Cruz that is also home to many non-English speakers. Despite the challenges, however, the court boasts a 90-plus percent juror turnout, which Guzman attributes to its method of summoning jurors.

Unlike most counties statewide that send summonses via mail, Santa Cruz County still summons people by phone.

"I like that, even though it's not the most practical way to do it," Guzman said of the phone calls. "We tried mailing them out as a pilot but it wasn't successful."

Randomized process

Twice a year the court goes through a "merge and purge" process in which staff compile data from voter registration and motor vehicle department records to create a list of potential jurors.

Guzman called it an "extremely randomized process," noting the lists are all computer generated.

From that list, he said, the court will send out juror affidavit questionnaires to about 4,000 people each year, depending on the number of trials on the calendar.

The questionnaires help determine if recipients are eligible to serve as a juror and must be returned by mail within 10 days and they can also be answered online. Those who are under the age of 18, are not U.S. citizens or have a felony conviction cannot serve on a jury.

Guzman encouraged prospective jurors to return the questionnaire "on the first call" to avoid further action from the court.

He also cautioned jurors to be careful of telephone scams in which people have been known to claim they're calling from the jury commissioner's office when in fact they're trying to collect information.

"Most likely a scam will call to get information from you," Guzman said. "We're calling to give you information not to collect information from them."

Guzman said the number of prospective jurors summoned for a case is determined by the judge and depends on the type of case, charges, and parties involved.

If a prospective juror doesn't show up for jury duty, they'll be put back on the list and called for a future trial.

For example, 76 of the 80 prospective jurors who were summoned last Wednesday reported to court. Of the four people who didn't show up, Guzman said, three were called for jury duty again this week.

In addition to being rescheduled, someone who shirks jury duty can be found in contempt of court and fined up to \$500.

"It is our civic duty, our responsibility as citizens to serve as a juror and provide a fair trial," he said.

However, many try to get out of that responsibility. Guzman said some of the most commonly used excuses for not being able to serve on a jury is the lack of transportation, medical issues or not being able to speak English.

Judge Thomas Fink added later that some prospective jurors also ask to be excused because they're the sole caretaker of a young child or elderly parent or are the only employee at a business that can do a particular job or task.

The court can be flexible though, especially with people who can prove that they have a scheduling conflict, such as a planned trip or medical procedure, or with full-time students.

in the state, along with Willcox and the Verde Valley in Northern Arizona.

According to a 2013 study, commissioned by the Arizona Wine Growers Association, wine production in the state is valued at \$2.2 million, with about 93 percent of the business occurring in southeastern Arizona.

"More people are looking to purchase land and start wineries out here," said Lori Reynolds, winemaker at Sonoita Vineyards. "I see really great things coming (for Arizona wine)."

Sonoita Vineyards is the oldest continually operating winery in Arizona, opening in 1983. The winery got its start when Reynolds' grandfather, Gordon Dutt, a former soil scientist with the University of Arizona, researched wine-growing near Elgin.

The soil composition in the area, he discovered, is a "99 percent" match to what is found in the wine-producing region of Burgundy in France. Following the experiment, Dutt acquired land south of Elgin and planted a vineyard there.

Over the years, Reynolds has seen wineries spring up along the rural roads extending out from Sonoita Vineyard's 60-acre farm. Reynolds said it's "exciting" watching new startups bring more attention to the region's wine-growing prowess.

"Because now we're not a surprise," Reynolds said, "and people don't say, 'What? There's wine in Arizona?'"

Guzman said he's called family members, court employees and even Judge Pro-Tem Kimberly Corsaro.

He said often jurors feel satisfied after serving on a jury. One example he noted was a family member who was reluctant to serve on a jury, but afterward said if she wouldn't have been on the jury the outcome of the trial might have been different.

Jury duty

Jurors are paid \$12 per day and are reimbursed for roundtrip mileage at a rate of about 45 cents per mile. If the trial lasts more than six days, jurors can qualify for additional money from the Arizona Lengthy Trial Fund.

Jurors who are retired or unemployed can receive up to \$40 per day and it is retroactive to the first day of trial. Employed jurors can earn up to \$300 per day if they can prove to the court that serving has led to a loss of income.

Eligible jurors have 30 days after the trial has concluded to submit their claim, though Guzman said this is rare, adding that last year there was only one lengthy jury trial.

Jurors who are selected to serve on a jury are ex-

cused from serving for two years.

If someone who served on a jury in the last two years receives a questionnaire, Guzman said, they can note the date they were summoned and they'll be excused or they can opt to serve again.

Keeping them engaged

Jurors are usually in court from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., making it a challenge to keep them engaged.

Fink said he often likes to work through lunch, taking smaller breaks throughout the day, and recessing at 2:30 p.m.

"By 4 p.m. people start to fade away," he said, adding later that he also "watches them very carefully" to make sure they're paying attention.

In Arizona, jurors are permitted to ask witnesses written questions, which also helps keep them actively engaged in the process.

Fink said the court is also working to implement new technology in the courtroom, such as monitors in the jury box that can display documents and evidence. The equipment, he said, will hopefully be donated by the federal court system, which has a surplus of monitors, at reasonable to no cost.


