We are writing this letter in regards to Johnson Utilities notification to The Golf Club at Johnson Ranch that they will no longer supply the course with effluent, treated sewer water for watering of the course. Instead they will only supply non-potable water, which will cause an increase in cost of by as much as 400 percent. No golf course in America could survive if they were forced to us non-potable water

It is our understanding from a news article on ABC15 that the course received notification via a letter dated February 19th to go into effect within 5 days. How can this possibly be legal? Were there not agreements already in place?

As a homeowner in the Johnson Ranch Community, we understand the exorbitant cost and poor quality of the water supplied by Johnson Utilities.

We bought our home in this community 5 years ago primarily because of the golf course. While we understand that not everyone in the community golf, the potential impact on those of us who use the golf course would financially cripple this community. The loss of the golf course would result in an immediate decrease in home values. As full-time residents, we are concerned about the impact on our community if the course were to be forced into bankruptcy causing loss of jobs and revenue for San Tan Valley.

We implore you to give this case your thoughtful consideration.
