II Interest in Proceeding

ALECA is comprised of small telephone companies and member-owned cooperatives, all of which are providing local exchange telecommunications services to customers in rural, high cost areas of Arizona, and all of which are "rural telephone companies" as defined by the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (the "Act") 47 U.S.C. 0 153(37). ALECA's members are:

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- Fort Mojave Telephone Company;
- Frontier Communications Corporation;
 - Gila River Telecommunications, Inc.;

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- Hopi Telecommunications, Inc.;
- Midvale Telephone Exchange, Inc.;
- San Carlos Apache Telecommunications Utility, Inc.;
- South Central Communications;
- Table Top Telephone Company, Inc.;
- TDS;
- · Tohono O'odham Utility Authority; and
- Valley Telephone Cooperative; and
- Zona Communications.¹

Each ALECA member, including its Tribally-owned members, receives support from the Federal Universal Service Fund ("FUSF") in the form of High Cost Support. Each also provides discounted Lifeline telephone service and receives compensation for the discounts from the FUSF.

TracFone Wireless, Inc. ("TracFone") was designated as an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier ("ETC") by Decision No. 72222, dated March 9, 2011, in Docket No. T-20664A-09-0148. Decision No. 72222 (at 13-14) approved an agreement between TracFone, ACC Staff, and ALECA, that "TracFone would not attempt to provide its SafeLink Wireless@ Lifeline service to eligible residents on Tribal Lands." Tracfone also agreed to implement procedural safeguards to ensure that it would not provide lifeline service to tribal residents on Tribal Lands.

TracFone now seeks relief from its commitments to the parties and the Commission in Docket No. T-20664A-09-0148. However, TracFone ignores the fundamental issue: the Commission has very limited jurisdiction concerning Tribal Lands. The Commission has jurisdiction over public service corporations providing service within the State of Arizona, not on federally recognized Tribal Lands. If TracFone wants to provide lifeline service on Tribal Lands, then it must first seek permission from the appropriate Tribal regulatory authorities. Only

1 with this condition satisfied, could the Commission arguably authorize Tracfone to expand its 2 service area.
