PUBLIC NOTICE OF THE APPLICATION OF TABLE TOP TELEPHONE COMPANY, INC. FOR APPROVAL OF A RATE INCREASE FOR RESIDENTIAL TELEPHONE SERVICE (DOCKET NO. T-02724A-13-0416 / DOCKET NO. T-0274A-17-0034)

Summary

On November 13, 2014, the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") issued Decision No. 74830. This Decision authorized Table Top Telephone Company, Inc. ("Table Top") to increase Table Top's rates for residential local exchange service to \$18, effective June 1, 2016.

On February 3, 2017, Table Top filed an application in Docket No. T-0274A-17-0034 for an expedited rate increase in residential rates to the current \$20.00 floor set by the FCC. On March 28, 2017, Table Top also filed a petition in Docket No. T-0274A-13-0416 to amend Decision No. 74830 to remove a requirement that Table Top must file a full rate application to increase residential rates to the \$20.00 floor. In these two filings, Table Top alleged among other things that continuing reductions in federal support had caused Table Top's 2017 projected net income to be negative even without the increase to \$20 and to just 0.30% with the increase.

On ______,2017, the Commission granted Table Top's motion to consolidate Dockets T-0274A-17-0034 and T-0274A-13-0416. On ______, 2017, in Decision No. ______, the Commission granted Table Top's petition to remove the requirement in Decision No. 74830 that Table Top must file a full rate application to increase residential rates to the \$20.00 floor.

The Commission's Utilities Division ("Staff') is in the process of auditing and analyzing the application, and has not yet made any recommendations regarding Table Top's proposed water and wastewater rates. The Commission will determine the appropriate relief to be granted based on the evidence of record in the proceeding. THE COMMISSION IS NOT BOUND BY THE PROPOSALS MADE BY TABLE TOP, STAFF, OR ANY INTERVENOR(S); THEREFORE, THE FINAL RATES APPROVED BY THE COMMISSION MAY DIFFER FROM AND MAY BE HIGHER OR LOWER THAN THE RATES REQUESTED BY TABLE TOP OR RECOMMENDED BY OTHER PARTIES.

About Intervention

The law provides for an open public hearing at which, under appropriate circumstances, interested persons may intervene. An interested person may be granted intervention if the outcome of the case will directly and substantially impact the person, and the person's

intervention will not unduly broaden the issues in the case. Intervention, among other things, entitles a party to present sworn evidence at hearing and to cross-examine other parties' witnesses. However, failure to intervene will not preclude any interested person or entity from appearing at the hearing and providing public comment on the application or from filing written comments in the record of the case.

To request intervention, you must file an **original and 13 hard copies** of a written request to intervene with Docket Control, 1200 West Washington Street, Phoenix, AZ 85007, **no later than______, 2017**. You also **must** serve a copy of the request to intervene on each party of record, on the same day that you file the request to intervene with the Commission. Information about intervention and sample intervention requests are available on the Commission's website (<u>www.azcc.gov</u>) using the "Intervention in Utility Cases" link.

Your request to intervene must contain the following:

- 1. Your name, address, and telephone number, and the name, address, and telephone number of any person upon whom service of documents is to be made, if not yourself;
- 2. A reference to Docket No. T-02724A-13-0416;
- 3. A short statement of your interest in the proceeding (e.g., a customer of the utility, a shareholder of the utility, etc.); how you will be directly and substantially affected by the outcome of the case; and why your intervention will not unduly broaden the issues in this case;
- 4. A statement certifying that a copy of the request to intervene has been mailed to Table Top or its counsel and to all other parties of record in the case; and
- 5. If you are not represented by an attorney who is an active member of the Arizona State Bar, and you are not representing yourself as an individual, information and any appropriate documentation to demonstrate compliance with Arizona Supreme Court Rules 31, 38, and 42, as applicable.

The granting of motions to intervene is governed by A.AC. R14-3-105, except that <u>all motions to</u> <u>intervene must be filed on or before</u>, 2017. If representation by counsel is required by Arizona Supreme Court Rule 31, intervention will be conditioned upon the intervenor obtaining counsel to represent the intervenor.
