INTRODUCTION

Enclosed are the Commission Staff's memorandum and proposed order for THE APPLICATION OF UNS ELECTRIC, INC. FOR APPROVAL OF A TEMPORARY PURCHASED POWER AND FUEL ADJUSTMENT CLAUSE CREDIT FOR THE PERIOD OF JUNE 1, 2017 THROUGH OCTOBER 31, 2017 (DOCKET NO. E-04204A-17-0082)

This is only a Staff recommendation to the Commission; it has not yet become an order of the Commission. The Commission can decide to accept, amend or reject Staff's proposed order.

BACKGROUND

On March 27, 2017, UNS Electric, Inc. ("UNS Electric" or "Company") filed an application for approval of a temporary Purchased Power and Fuel Adjustment Clause ("PPFAC") credit adjustment of \$0.0125 per kilowatt-hour ("kWh") for the period of June 1, 2017, through October 31, 2017.

The PPFAC rate tracks the changes in the cost of obtaining power supplies based upon a historical 12-month rolling average of fuel, purchased power, and purchased transmission costs. The

PPFAC is adjusted monthly, but under Decision No. 74235, it is banded so that it cannot increase or decrease by more than 0.83% from the preceding month's rate.

Under UNS Electric's PPFAC Plan of Administration, if the PPFAC balance becomes overcollected by more than \$10 million, UNS Electric must either file for a PPFAC rate adjustment within 45 days; or contact Staff to discuss why a PPFAC rate adjustment is not necessary at that time.

The PPFAC bank balance is predicted to be over-collected by \$10 million in May 2017; therefore, UNS Electric proposes to implement a temporary PPFAC credit of \$0.0125 per kWh for the period of June 1, 2017, through October 31, 2017. The Company also requests that the temporary credit be terminated in the event the PPFAC bank balance reaches zero at any time during the proposed term.

Further, the Company requests expedited treatment of this application to ensure that the adjustment is effective as of June 1, 2017.

STAFF ANALYSIS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The proposed credit would be applied to customers' bills during the peak summer usage period of June through October. This will provide a benefit to ratepayers during the period when electricity bills are the highest.

UNS Electric considered a range of credit rates including a \$0.01 per kWh credit, a \$0.0125 per kWH credit or a \$0.015 per kWh credit. UNS Electric identified the \$0.0125 credit as its preferred alternative resulting in a decrease of \$12.30 per month (11.8%) in an average monthly residential summer bill. The impacts of the various credit rates on the typical residential consumer bill and the projected 2017 corresponding bank balance are summarized in Table I below.

UNS Electric's projections indicate that, without a credit to ratepayers, the PPFAC bank balance will continue to increase (absent a dramatic price increase in natural gas and wholesale power) with a projected over-collection by the end of October 2017 in excess of \$15 million. Although the over-collected bank balance would be lowest at a \$0.015 kWh credit rate, Staff believes that there would also be an increased risk that a relatively small increase in natural gas and wholesale THE COMMISSION April 25, 2017 Page 3

power prices could result in under-collection and possibly the need for a surcharge. UNS Electric has expressed this very concern regarding selection of an overly aggressive credit rate, and has requested the right to terminate the credit in the event that the bank balance reaches zero.

Staff recommends that the Commission approve a temporary credit adjustment of \$0.0125 per kWh to the PPFAC rate beginning June 1, 2017, through October 31, 2017.

Staff further recommends that the Company be authorized to terminate the temporary credit in the event the PPFAC bank balance reaches zero at any time during the proposed term, provided that the Company notifies the Commission within 15 days of its decision to terminate the credit.

8	10. Staff has recommended that the Commission approve a temporary credit adjustment of
9	\$0.0125 per kWh to the PPFAC rate beginning June 1, 2017, through October 31, 2017.
10	11. Staff has further recommended that the Company be authorized to terminate the temporary
11	credit in the event the PPFAC bank balance reaches zero at any time during the proposed term,
12	provided that the Company notifies the Commission within 15 days of its decision to terminate the
13	credit.
14	CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
15	1. UNS Electric, Inc. is an Arizona public service corporation within the meaning of Article XV,
16	Section 2, of the Arizona Constitution.
17	2. The Commission has jurisdiction over UNS Electric, Inc. and over the subject matter of the
18	application.
19	3. The Commission, having reviewed the application and Staff's memorandum dated April 14,
20	2017, concludes that it is in the public interest to approve a temporary credit adjustment to the
21	Purchased Power and Fuel Adjustment Clause at the rate of \$0.0125 per kWh beginning June 1, 2017
22	through October 31, 2017.
23	ORDER
24	IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that a temporary credit adjustment to the Purchased Power
25	and Fuel Adjustment Clause at the rate of \$0.0125 per kWh beginning June 1, 2017, through October
26	31, 2017, is hereby approved as discussed herein.
