
208 Streamlining Approved

- On August 26, 2015, the MAG Regional Council approved the Proposal for Streamlining the 208 Water Quality Management Plan Process.
- The streamlining efforts shorten the 208 Process from approximately 18 to 24 months to approximately 9 months.
- The changes result in a 50 to 63 percent reduction in the overall timeline.



Small Plant Process Streamlining Approved

- On December 16, 2015, the MAG Regional Council approved the Proposal for Streamlining the MAG 208 Water Quality Management Plan Small Plant Review and Approval Process.
- The streamlining efforts shorten the Small Plant Process from approximately 12 to 17 months to approximately 6 months.
- The changes result in a 50 to 65 percent reduction in the overall timeline.
