Hains, Staff Attorney, Legal Division, on 20 behalf of the Safety Division of the Arizona Corporation Commission. 21 22 BY THE COMMISSION: 23 Having considered the entire record herein and being fully advised in the premises, the Arizona 24 Corporation Commission ("Commission") finds, concludes, and orders that: 25 FINDINGS OF FACT 26 1. On March 6, 2017, the Arizona Department of Transportation ("ADOT") filed with the 27 Commission an application for approval to construct and maintain a new grade separated structure, 28

USDOT No. 441-073C, and to allow the Union Pacific Railroad Company ("Railroad") to remove an existing at-grade public crossing, USDOT No. 741-811U, in Phoenix, Arizona, State Route 202 South Mountain Freeway at 59th Avenue, MP 899.70 ("Application").

- 2. On March 10, 2017, a Procedural Order was issued scheduling a hearing in this matter and setting various procedural deadlines.
- On May 12, 2017, the Commission's Railroad Safety Section ("Staff") filed a Staff 3. Memorandum recommending approval of the Application.
- 4. On June 21, 2017, a public hearing was convened, as scheduled. ADOT, the Railroad, and Staff appeared through counsel. ADOT and Staff presented evidence through witnesses who were available for cross-examination. No members of the public were present.
 - 5. No intervention requests were received.

ADOT's Application

- 6. Representatives from ADOT, the Railroad, and Staff participated in a diagnostic review meeting of the proposed improvements to the crossing. All parties who were present were in agreement of the proposed improvements to the crossing.²
- 7. In its Application, ADOT is seeking Commission approval to construct a new grade separated crossing, USDOT No. 441-073C, over the railroad tracks along the new South Mountain Freeway alignment and for the Railroad to remove an existing at-grade crossing, USDOT No. 741-811U, at 59th Avenue in Phoenix, Maricopa County, Arizona.³
- The crossing is currently protected with flashing lights, gates, and cantilevers.⁴ The 8. proposed improvements would allow ADOT to construct a grade separated structure that would span the railroad tracks and once in service the existing crossing would be removed.⁵ The at-grade crossing would remain open during construction, first for public traffic, then for construction traffic upon completion of the western half of the overpass.6

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9. The proposed improvements are estimated to take 24 months to construct, and is tentatively scheduled to start in the winter of 2017. The estimated cost of the proposed improvements is \$1.3 million.8

Testimony

- 10. At the hearing, Mr. Saveed Hani, the State's Railroad Liaison, testified in support of the Application. Mr. Hani testified that the proposed improvements are part of a 22-mile project that expands the I-10 highway, and that the proposed improvements are three bridges, one serving as the mainline and the other two as frontage roads.9
- Mr. Hani further testified that the proposed improvements will be constructed in the 11. winter of 2017 and that it is being funded by a number of agencies, with the Railroad contributing \$1,347,836, which is 5 percent of the total cost of the 22-mile project (\$26,956,722). 10
- Mr. Hani further testified that there are roughly 2,400 vehicles per day going north and 12. south on 59th avenue and that the posted speed limit is 45 miles per hour. 11 Mr. Hani further testified that there will not be any traffic delays because it is a grade separation project and because 59th Avenue will be open the whole time to traffic. 12
- Mr. Hani further testified that he believes removing the existing at-grade crossing and 13. constructing a grade separation structure is in the public interest and increases public safety. 13
- Mr. Chris Watson, the Railroad Safety Supervisor for the Commission, testified that the 14. Staff Memorandum, which describes the nature of the proposed improvements, was prepared by him or under his direction.¹⁴ Mr. Watson further testified that the proposed improvements are consistent with an upgrade of this nature and that it would improve the safety at the crossing.¹⁵ Mr. Watson further testified that the costs that have been listed are consistent with an upgrade of this nature and that the proposed method of the construction, keeping the existing crossing open while it is being

constructed, is appropriate.16

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15. Mr. Watson further testified that Staff would not object to a longer time frame to complete the proposed improvements, specifically 36 months, in order to have sufficient time to remove the existing at-grade crossing once construction is completed.¹⁷

Staff's Recommendation

- 16. Staff recommends the Application be approved. 18
- 17. Staff's recommendation is reasonable and appropriate and should be adopted.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Commission has jurisdiction over the parties and over the subject matter of the Application pursuant to Article XV of the Arizona Constitution and A.R.S. §§ 40-336, 40-337 and 40-337.01.
 - 2. Notice of the Application was provided in accordance with the law.
- The installation of the crossings upgrade, as discussed herein, is necessary for the public's convenience and safety.
- 4. Pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 40-336 and 40-337, the crossings upgrade should be approved as recommended by Staff.
- 5. Upon completion of the crossings upgrade, the Union Pacific Railroad Company should maintain the crossings in accordance with A.A.C. R14-5-104.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Arizona Department of Transportation's Application, as discussed in the Application and Staff Memorandum, is hereby approved.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Union Pacific Railroad Company shall complete the crossings upgrade, as discussed in the Application and Staff Memorandum, within thirty-six months of the effective date of this Decision.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Union Pacific Railroad Company shall notify the Commission, in writing, within ten days of both the commencement and completion of the crossings
